H1N1 SWINE FLU VACCINE and MASS CLINIC UPDATE

Please continue to check sfcdcp.org/flu for ongoing updates

At mass public clinics,

- All vaccinations will be entered into the California Immunization Registry (CAIR)
- All vaccinations will be free
- All vaccine recipients will be given a vaccination card with a record of the type of vaccine they have received (LAIV or TIV).

Mass vaccination clinics are **not** intended to replace hospital-based vaccination efforts or other regular routes of flu vaccine delivery (providers, clinics, pharmacies, supermarkets, etc). Rather, they are to maximize the utilization of the early, limited supply of H1N1 swine flu vaccine to high risk individuals and health care workers.

San Francisco Department of Public Health is soliciting volunteer assistance to work at these mass public clinics. If you are interested in helping, please visit www.sfdph.org/flu and click on the "Volunteer to Help" section. We're looking for people who are polite, public-spirited, enjoy interacting with others and possess a helpful and positive attitude. Fluency in other languages is a plus.

A very limited amount of LAIV H1N1 swine flu vaccine is arriving in early October. It is restricted for use in healthy children ages 2-18 years. This will be distributed directly to Kaiser and to the 30 pediatric practices in San Francisco that requested LAIV vaccine on the CalPanFlu.org website.

The first substantial shipment of H1N1 swine flu vaccine (all types) is still expected in mid to late October and is to be used at mass public clinics and hospitals. Subsequent shipments will be distributed directly to all registrants on CalPanFlu.org.

We will continue to send updated information as we receive it, as well as post information at www.sfcdcp.org/flu.
