Avoiding Administration Errors with Shingles Vaccine

The US Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) has been receiving reports of vaccine administration errors related to shingles (herpes zoster) immunization. The reports indicate confusion between the live, attenuated vaccine Zostavax® and the new recombinant, adjuvanted vaccine, Shingrix®. Please take note of the following important tips for storing and administering Shingrix:

- Shingrix is supplied as <u>2 components</u>: one vial with the freeze-dried vaccine granules, and a second vial with the liquid adjuvant.
- Both Shingrix components must be stored in the <u>refrigerator</u> between 2-8°C (36-46°F). Do not put Shingrix in the freezer. Discard if the vaccine has been frozen.
- Reconstitute the vaccine by injecting the Shingrix adjuvant liquid into the Shingrix freeze-dried vaccine vial, according to the package insert. Do not use any other liquid for reconstitution.
 After reconstitution, administer immediately or store refrigerated and use within 6 hours.
 Discard reconstituted vaccine if not used within 6 hours.
- Administer Shingrix intramuscularly in the deltoid muscle.
- <u>2 doses</u> of Shingrix are required, regardless of whether the patient received Zostavax in the past. Give the 2nd dose 2-6 months after the first. If more than 6 months has elapsed between doses, give the 2nd dose as soon as you can; there is no need to restart the series. However if the 2nd dose was given less than 4 weeks after the first, the 2nd dose should be repeated.
- Shingrix is recommended for immunocompetent adults aged ≥ 50 years, including those who
 previously received Zostavax. Shingrix is preferred over Zostavax for the prevention of
 shingles and its complications.
