

# Health Advisory Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine Approval: Information for Clinicians

# Situational Update: Moderna Vaccine

- The <u>Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee</u> (VRBPAC) of the FDA voted to recommend approval of the Moderna mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (12/17/2020).
- The FDA issued an <u>Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) for Moderna Vaccine</u> (12/18/2020), complete with the required Fact Sheets for Healthcare Providers and for Patients, translated into numerous languages.
- The CDC's Advisory Committee on Vaccination Practices (ACIP) confirmed the safety and
  efficacy of the vaccine and issued an <u>interim recommendation</u> for use of Moderna vaccine in
  persons aged ≥18 years for the prevention of COVID-19 (12/20/2020).
- The first doses of Moderna COVID-19 vaccine are expected to reach San Francisco this week and next, and will be distributed to facilities in accordance with <a href="Phase 1A allocation guidelines">Phase 1A allocation guidelines</a> published by the California Department of Public Health. Additional doses are expected to arrive during the weeks to follow.

### Situational Update: Pfizer-BioNTech Vaccine

- Limited quantities of Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine are reaching San Francisco and are being
  distributed to facilities in accordance with <a href="Phase 1A allocation guidelines">Phase 1A allocation guidelines</a> published by the
  California Department of Public Health. Additional doses are expected to arrive during the
  weeks to follow.
